

A-NZ SCHOOLS CHALLENGE



Waikari Controllers Report - Tim Farrant "route choice - with occasional control choice"

Waikari, a lovely map situated in picturesque limestone country - renowned for its nice open farmland and relatively straightforward courses. Who better to stir up this easygoing reputation than navigational bad boys, Andrew Johnstone and Tim Farrant!

On arrival, both Andy and I were greeted to a warm clear morning with a beautiful sunrise. In fact, it wasn't until the first starter had cleared and checked that the sky opened to drench more than a hundred brave orienteers who ventured out. We even got a bit short of long red maps towards the end. Quite unexpected, given the last event we planned is well known as one of PAPO's toughest sufferfests in recent history, the Craigieburn incident.

About noon the wind picked up and the weather cleared allowing many to finish the course a bit warmer than they went out.

However, remaining brisk were the sales of Morrocan lamb by the local community group. As a personal endorsement, it was well worth the \$5 I bludged off Andy.

Most of the feedback received was very positive, with many commenting on how much they enjoyed the first few controls along the stream. Our only complainant didn't like getting wet feet - shouldn't have gone running in the rain buddy!

Thanks to our landowners for providing access to the area, club volunteers and the control collectors. Every contribution was valued in the smooth running of the event.

Chris Forne was the long red winner on the day, winning the long red course in an excellent time of 47 minutes, 40 seconds.

maze and discovering some little visited or noticed features in the park. In retrospect the compass skills course needed to have the control numbers listed for confirmation that the orienteer had not strayed from the correct bearing. There were some impressive efforts in the score event with almost all corners of Hagley Park visited in under one hour, but in their haste a few people had some incorrect answers, suggesting that oxygen debt affected the ability to correctly place the control site or interpret the question or count or possibly just legibly write the answer. There were a few clipcards or clue sheets with names or start times missing, so apologies if an

administrative error means that your name

doesn't appear in the results.

General Information <u>*WHISTLES *</u> EVERYONE please note that carrying a whistle while running a course is recommended.

Cancellations - Events are usually only cancelled in the event of extreme conditions such as heavy snow, flooding, dangerous river conditions etc., which are more likely to affect mountain areas. Should an event be cancelled, **NewstalkZB 1098 AM** will be notified. Cancellations are repeated half-hourly from 6 am, then hourly from 9 am.

Start times - vary and are published in the event notices. For most club events registration is from 10am, the first start is 10:30am and the last start is 1:00pm. Course closure is 2.30pm so late starters only have 90 minutes for their run.

Finishing and Course Closure - Please remember to always come to the finish area, whether you finished your course or not and hand in your control card or punch the finish box, so that we can account for everyone who started. Course closure is the time at which you MUST have returned to the finish area even if you have not yet completed your course. It is at this time that the organisers may start taking in controls (and looking for you if you have not returned).

Helpers - All members are asked to be helpers during the year. The Volunteer Co-ordinator will contact you by email or by phone and the Chief Organiser will contact you shortly afterwards to make arrangements. Please contact them when you arrive at the event. Helpers who set up/pack up/work on registration may opt for a free run on the day or receive VIP points.

Control collection - Please offer to collect controls at the end of the event and receive VIP points. **Dogs** - No dogs on Farmland please!

Permanent Courses: Three are available, with options to suit a wide range of abilities, including beginners/children and experienced orienteers. **Victoria Park:** maps (\$3.50) and full instructions are available at the Christchurch City Council Beckenham Service Centre, 66 Colombo St. (Open normal business hours; ph: 332-3099) and at the Port Hills Visitor Centre, Victoria Park: Groups planning to use the Course should let the Ranger know beforehand by phoning 332-9889. **Spencer Park:** maps and instructions are available at the Spencer Park Camp Shop, \$3 each. **Hokitika:** a park and street map outside CHCH but under PAPO's care. Starting in Cass Square Hokitika. Maps are available (FREEI) from the Hokitika Visitor Information Centre (I-site) or Westland District Council. You will need a pencil to write down the codes on the control.

Library - The club has a collection of orienteering books etc. available for members to borrow. General introduction to orienteering, plus training, coaching, course setting, fitness, and rogaining are covered by the 16 or so titles on the list. Some are older 10-20 year-old "classics", but we have recently added some new publications. In addition, look on the website Deb Web Page Links Deb the Little Book of Orienteering Techniques'.
