
Awards made at the AGM - Living Springs, Sunday 3 February

This spectacular trophy was donated in 2009, and for those who are new to the club or may have forgotten the details, read on....



At the end of 2008 members of the Te Kohaka o Tuhaitara Trust discussed with several Club members the idea of donating a perpetual trophy. This action was prompted by the positive relationship which had developed between the Trust and the Club during the preceding years. The Trust administers the Tuhaitara Coastal Reserve which includes the Club's Kairaki, Woodend and Pines Beach maps. The activities of PAPO matched the values of the Trust, in particular, caring for the land in minimising environmental damage and providing recreational and educational opportunities for the general public.

It was felt by the committee that individual efforts are currently recognised by the Club – place getters at Championship events, Orienteer of the Year winners and Most Improved orienteers. The Trust was very happy with the suggestion that a "team" of orienteers be acknowledged and further discussions resulted in the trophy being awarded annually at the AGM to the Planner, Controller and Organiser of the event considered by the membership to be worthy of the title 'Event of the Year'.

Peninsula and Plains Orienteers **President's 2012 Report to the AGM** 3 February 2013

- Bryan Jenkins President PAPO 2012

For 2012 it has been "a tale of two committees". One has been the PAPO committee looking after day-to-day business; the other has been the Nationals 2013 committee. This has meant that there were many newcomers on the PAPO committee which has allowed many of our experienced members to focus on PAPO hosting the New Zealand Nationals at Easter 2013.

The club successfully ran 10 club events, 4 OY events, 3 days of the Canterbury Championships, 7 twilight events, the South Island School Championships, the Canterbury School Championships, 3 events of the national Super Series, 6 MTBO events and 2 night navigation/MTBO events, and, the family fun day with Christchurch City Council during 2012. We also supported a number of fund raising events to assist PAPO orienteers to participate in national and world events. We did have to cancel one OY event which suggests we are at the limits of what members are able to contribute to running events and administering club activities.

For 2013 we have planned a similar level of activity with 9 club events, 5 OY events, 6 twilight events, 4 National events, 3 Canterbury championship events, 2 days of Canterbury schools events, 3 schools training events, 2 night navigation/MTBO events and the Heights of Winter rogaine. I encourage you all to be involved in organising and participating in these events.

PAPO membership for 2012 was 242. This is a 7% increase on 2011 but is 15% below our pre-earthquake numbers. This pattern is similar to other sports in Christchurch.

Two accidents in recent times highlighted the importance of health & safety issues

at events. One (in 2011) on a remote map which required the services of the Westpac helicopter led the Committee to purchase a stretcher and a personal locator beacon. The other was at a street event involving a car and highlighted problems for visibility of runners and the care needed by participants in street events.

Access to land for orienteering events is becoming more challenging and more expensive. There are increasing requests for payment for use of land and increases in payments where modest payments have been required in the past. Also we had a difficult decision in relation to the presence of European wasps on a promising map site for the Nationals event. The peak occurrence of wasps is at the time of the year that the Nationals are being run and it was decided not to use the area for the Nationals. PAPO has been working with DOC and other recreational groups to assist in providing funding and people to assist in a long term wasp control programme. These issues are increasing the cost of events for the club and increase the time demands on our members.

There were some very strong individual performances in the year, particularly with the junior boys: M10 Matthew Harding (1st Oceania); M12 Tom Harding (places in 3 national events and Oceania) and Dominic Cleary (1st in middle distance nationals plus places in the other events); M14 Cameron Metherell (1st in middle distance in Nationals and 2nd in sprint); Connor Cleary (2nd in long distance in nationals); Stephen Harding (1st Oceania); M16 Ed Cory-Wright (places in all national events); Nick Smith (1st Oceania); M18 William Richardson (places in sprint and middle distance in nationals): Joshua Campbell (2nd Oceania); and M20 Alastair Richardson (2nd Oceania). There were also

good results with junior girls: W10 Annabel Lapworth (1st in the middle and the long at the nationals), Kaia Joergensen (places in the long at nationals and Oceania); W14 Katie Cory-Wright (1st in middle at nationals and 2nd at Oceania), Briana Steven (2nd at Oceania); W18 Rebecca Batin (3rd in middle at nationals); W20 Selena Metherell (places in the sprint, middle and long at the nationals).

Senior results of note included: M21 Carsten Joergensen (2nd in the long at nationals and Oceania) Tane Cambridge (3rd in sprint); M45 Alistair Cory-Wright (1st in the long at the nationals and 2nd at Oceania); M50 Andrew McGowan (2nd in the sprint at the nationals): W21 Georgia Whitla (3rd in the sprint at the nationals); W40 Jenni Adams (1st in Oceania long and 3rd in the sprint), Sarah Wright (3rd at Oceania); W45 Julia Fettes (1st in the middle and long at the nationals). Jan Harrison (3rd in the sprint and long at the nationals); W50 Jean Cory-Wright (1st in the middle and long and 2nd in the sprint at the nationals), Linley Earnshaw (1st in the sprint at the nationals); and W70 Kath Adams (places in all nationals events).

Many PAPO members represented New Zealand: Nick Smith and Ed Cory-Wright in the Schools team; Ryan Batin and Selena Metherell at JWOC; Tane Cambridge at WOC; Jenni Adams, Lara Prince, Georgia Whitla, Chris Forne and Tane Cambridge in the World Cup series. Ten PAPO members were in the ANZ Challenge: Ed Cory-Wright, Will Richardson, Alistair Richardson, Tim Wright, Alistair Cory-Wright, Alister Metherell, Selena Metherell, Jenni Adams, Julia Fettes and Jean Cory-Wright

As the supplies of PAPO uniforms dwindled it was time to look at the design of the PAPO uniform. A group of enthusiastic juniors worked with Katie Bolt to develop a new design which was unveiled at Akaroa. A system for ordering is being prepared so that members can purchase the new uniforms. Thank you to the juniors on their innovative design.

General Information <u>*WHISTLES *</u> EVERYONE please note that carrying a whistle while running a course is recommended.

Cancellations - Events are usually only cancelled in the event of extreme conditions such as heavy snow, flooding, dangerous river conditions etc., which are more likely to affect mountain areas. Should an event be cancelled, **NewstalkZB 1098 AM** will be notified. Cancellations are repeated half-hourly from 6 am, then hourly from 9 am.

Start times - vary and are published in the event notices. For most club events registration is from 10am, the first start is 10:30am and the last start is 1:00pm. Course closure is 2.30pm so late starters only have 90 minutes for their run.

Finishing and Course Closure - Please remember to always come to the finish area, whether you finished your course or not and hand in your control card or punch the finish box, so that we can account for everyone who started. Course closure is the time at which you MUST have returned to the finish area even if you have not yet completed your course. It is at this time that the organisers may start taking in controls (and looking for you if you have not returned).

Helpers - All members are asked to be helpers during the year. The Volunteer Co-ordinator will contact you by email or by phone and the Chief Organiser will contact you shortly afterwards to make arrangements. Please contact them when you arrive at the event. Helpers who set up/pack up/work on registration may opt for a free run on the day or receive VIP points.

Control collection - Please offer to collect controls at the end of the event and receive VIP points. **Dogs** - No dogs on Farmland please!

Permanent Courses: Three are available, with options to suit a wide range of abilities, including beginners/children and experienced orienteers. **Victoria Park:** maps (\$3.50) and full instructions are available at the Christchurch City Council Beckenham Service Centre, 66 Colombo St. (Open normal business hours; ph: 332-309) and at the Port Hills Visitor Centre, Victoria Park. Groups planning to use the Course should let the Ranger know beforehand by phoning 332-9889. **Spencer Park:** maps and instructions are available at the Spencer Park Camp Shop, \$3 each. **Hokitika:** a park and street map outside CHCH but under PAPO's care. Starting in Cass Square Hokitika. Maps are available (FREEI) from the Hokitika Visitor Information Centre (I-site) or Westland District Council. You will need a pencil to write down the codes on the control.

Library - The club has a collection of orienteering books etc. available for members to borrow in the caravan. General introduction to orienteering, plus training, coaching, course setting, fitness, and rogaining are covered by the 16 or so titles on the list. Some are older 10-20 year-old "classics", but we have recently added some new publications. In addition, look on the website \rightarrow Web Page Links \rightarrow 'the Little Book of Orienteering Techniques'.
